Matt Gordon has been a teacher candidate in a course called Prof 191 Theory and Professional Practice at the Faculty of Education. The on-campus portion of the course deals with essentials of planning, classroom management and teaching strategies. As the instructor, for this course, and as a former high school principal, I also act as the Faculty Liaison for the schools in which the teacher candidates are placed for their practicum. In that role, I visit each school and assess the teacher candidates in their classrooms.
